

NRHS Clay Target Charting

The 5 “directional marks” left, half left, center, half right and right are used as a slash indicating the approximate angle of each shot as seen by the shooter from each station. Make a mark on the chart that reflects the shot direction.

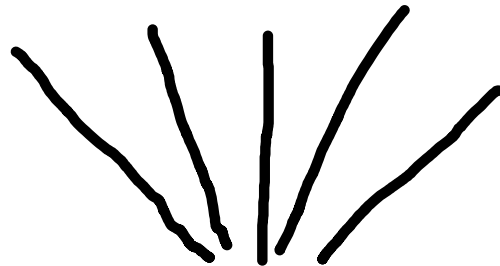
Below the angle charting line is a place to evaluate the actual break of the target. This is an important piece of data as well for evaluation. We will use four indicators or numbers here. They are 0, 1, 2, 3.

0 – placing a 0 below the angle slash indicates that the target was “missed” or lost.

1 – placing a 1 below the slash indicates that a small piece or “chip” came off the target.

2 – Placing a 2 below the slash indicates that the target was an “average” break.

3 – Placing a 3 below the slash indicates that the target was demolished or “smoked”.
